## THE CLAN MACPHERSON ASSOCIATION

The Clan Association was founded in 1947 by a group of distinguished clansmen including Sir Stewart Macpherson, Lord Macpherson of Drumochter, Lord Drumalbyn, Lt. Col. A. K. Macpherson of Pitmain M.V.O. and many others prominent in church and public life. Today, the Association is world-wide with branches in Scotland, England and Wales, New Zealand, Australia, South Africa, United States and Canada.

The objectives of our Association are twofold: first, the preserving and strengthening of the traditions of the Clan Macpherson; and second, the gathering and preservation of historic Clan documents and relics. These objectives are achieved in three principal ways:

- The Association owns an attractive Clan House in Newtonmore, Inverness-shire, Scotland, which contains a Museum housing many priceless relics and Clan treasures from Cluny Castle and other sources. Here too, a growing body of historic Clan documents is being collected. The Clan House provides clansmen from all parts of the world with a rallying place in the heart of the Macpherson country and each may feel that he owns at least a few inches of the soil in the land of his ancestors.
- The Association publishes an annual magazine, "Creag Dhubh", which, in itself, is well worth the cost of membership. The magazine is illustrated and contains many interesting articles about the history and traditions of the Clan Macpherson as well as a complete account of present day Clan activities in all parts of the world.
- 3. Annual Clan Gatherings and Rallies provide an opportunity for members to meet their fellow clansmen and enjoy the association with those of their own name.
