REGIONAL ACTIVITIES

he Canadian Branch of the CMA covers Canada from coast to coast to coast and beyond. We have members located in all 10 provinces, the USA, the UK, New Zealand and Barbados. I am humbled by the responsibilities to serve you in some significant way as your Chairman. I am aware that most of our activities in recent times have been conducted in Eastern Canada principally in Ontario.

Your Executive has a mandate to improve intra-branch communications. Our first effort in this direction is the reintroduction of the Green Banner as an aperiodic newsletter. Why aperiodic? First it comes out on an irregular basis. As we are not rich, and must make several mailings at various times each year, we are preparing each issue to coincide with these to conserve our scarce resources. That is appropriate for an organization having its roots in Scotland!

Beyond the Green Banner, we have been racking our brains to find other ways to serve our members better and attract more of the clansmen and clanswomen that we know are out there. Before I launch into my appeal for help, let me share some statistics on the CMA Canadian Branch:

We have over 200 members in all with 182 residing in Canada, 15 in the USA and 5 offshore (or not in North America). In Canada the distribution by province is:

I sometimes ask myself why people join in the first place. One suggestion I can think of at this point is some local activities organized by the members in each area. Another that may be related to this is a telephone campaign to contact persons in the phone book bearing our clan names who may never have heard of us. If you could scare up a few interested people we would send a mailing to them to help close the deal. I would not worry about having too many potential members as we will handle all that you bring to our attention presuming you have talked to them first. This last idea can be executed even in locations with only one CMA member at present. In summary, you can help us by doing one or more of the following:

Volunteer to take on the job of organizing a group of members in your area to put on a small event for the purpose of bringing members together and meeting new potential members

Organize a group in your area to run a telephone campaign to attract clansmen and women to the CMA

Give us your ideas on how to serve you better and attract new members.
