RALLY AT QUEBEC CITY IN SEPTEMBER

our Executive is in the process of planning and executing the 2009 rally at Quebec City on September 11 to 13. At the AGM in 2008 we decided to venture out of Ontario and to tie in to local events of

a Clan or Scottish nature. The rally at Quebec fulfils this requirement admirably with the 250th anniversary this year of the Battle of the Plains of Abraham in which several Macphersons participated.

The 78th Fraser Highlanders who took part in this battle included some prominent

Macphersons amongst its officers and men. Today there is a heritage unit devoted to carrying on the history of the Frasers with garrisons across the country. This unit is organizing weekend celebrations of their own and have graciously consented to have the CMA participate in their activities on Sunday September 13, the actual date of the battle. This will include a march onto the Plains of Abraham, a sword exchange ceremony with the Franche Marine a francophone heritage unit with strong links to New France, a march to city hall in Old Quebec to receive the freedom of the city, ending with a service at St Andrews Presbyterian Church whose founding pastor was a Robert Macpherson.

Although every Canadian has heard about the Plains of Abraham during their school years, perhaps a little review is in order. Although it was the important battle for the English it was not the deciding factor that resulted in Canada becoming part of British North America.

The battle for Quebec started on June 24 1759 with the landing of the English at Levis across the St Lawrence River from Quebec. Artillery bombardment soon began and a war of nerves and manoeuvre was initiated. The English had the advantage of more trained regular troops, more artillery, and the dominance of the Royal Navy in the St Lawrence. The French side had more soldiers but less regulars and an excellent knowledge of the area. The French under the Marquis de Montcalm were forced to defend a large area to the east of Quebec where the ground was suitable for manoeuvring and contained many strategic points. As summer was coming to a close General Wolfe, the English Commander, realizing that a hard winter was coming, devised a daring plan to scale the heights to the west of the town where the defence was light.

The lead troops in this endeavour were the Highlanders against whom Wolfe, as a Major in the Duke of Cumberland's army at Culloden, had fought. Wolfe was impressed with the fighting prowess of the Highlanders and insisted that they be included in his force. Amongst other things to attract these soldiers, concessions were

made to allow the wearing of highland dress and the use of bagpipes both of which were proscribed by law in Britain following Culloden.



It is not well known that after the Battle of the Plains of Abraham, in which both Commanders lost their lives, the war continued with the French winning the Battle of St Foy to the west of Quebec in April 1760. This resulted in stalemate which wouldn't be broken until the Royal Navy appeared in the river

with supplies for the English in May. This led to a march on Montreal and the eventual surrender of New France in June. To dig deeper into this history, visit http://www.ccbn-nbc.gc.ca/_en/batailles.php?section=2 on the World Wide Web.

Quebec City is a modern seat of Government for the Province of Quebec. The old city on the heights still retains many of its walls and gates that existed in 1759. One of the gates – the St Jean, located just outside of the Place Royal Hotel, leads to a shopping street. A short walk down St Jean Street leads to the City Hall

and St Andrews Presbyterian Church. The Plains of Abraham are located a short distance to the south. There are many other features that are attractive in Quebec I suggest a visit to one of the tourism websites such as http://www.quebecregion.com/e/for more information

As I come to the end of this article I should note that most of the planning is complete. At this point, in March, some details remain to be settled but the most important thing is that the hotel is ready to receive your reservations. We have included a draft program for the weekend with this newsletter with an update promised for the next issue of the Green Banner due to be published early summer. Note however the hotel deal has a cut-off on August 11. Last year many members who wanted to attend the rally waited until the hotel prices had returned to normal and had problems. An early decision is indicated as Quebec is a busy place with high demand on its hotel rooms. I hope that all members will support our rally at this new location by attending in September. I am sure that you will agree that it is a very interesting and worthwhile venue to visit.
