and is disrupting our daily routines (some even worry if the tissue mills are going to shut down).

This is more aggressive than the SARS epidemic from a few years ago. Governments around the world have been taking steps including enforcing self-quarantine, closing venues and borders in an effort to effect a measure of control. Only time will tell as to the effectiveness of all this. Some politicians are saying a month or two. Reality says closer to four or five months.

I am inclined to recommend that we proceed with the planned 2020 CMA Canadian & US Joint Gathering and Branch AGMs. I will be consulting with the Principals regarding the event in both Canada and US as we share the investment of both time and money. It should be noted that hotel registration cancelation must be made no later than forty-five (45) days prior to your arrival date for the event.

Gathering registrations will be refunded in full, should the 2020 CMA Canada & United States Joint Gathering be cancelled

#### **MACPHERSONIANA**

arm Greetings from Badenoch. I'm Dr Mairi MacPherson, and I'm the new Development Officer at the Clan Macpherson Museum.

I stay in a small village called Hill of Fearn, about an hour north of Inverness - some of you may remember me and

my husband Jim (who goes by Seamus at home) from various Monday talks at the Gathering over the years. I'll be at the Gathering in August with a wee 'pop up museum' at the Duke - come say hello!

We'll be launching a new project soon called 'Macphersoniana', which is all about capturing YOUR Macpherson objects and stories! It's an ongoing digital exhibition that collects objects and stories associated with being a Macpherson.

It will explore the history of the Macphersons through these objects and stories in an online exhibition and repository that can be accessed from anywhere in the world.

But we need your help to make it happen! We want to tell YOUR stories - not those of objects already in the museum. Do you have an object that tells the story of your 'Macpherson-ness'?

Then share it with us as part of this digital exhibition! The definition of 'object' is very broad – it can be anything from a commemorative plate to a dress, from a picture to a letter. It can be a family heirloom passed down generations or something you bought last year.

It's your object and your story! It doesn't have to say 'Macpherson' on it, or be tartan, or in any way obviously connected to the clan.

To give an example, my husband Seamus won the golf tournament at the 2016 Gathering and was given an engraved quaich.

This has pride of place on top of our piano, and it's a Macphersoniana object - not because it is unique or particularly valuable, but because of the personal connection and the story it tells. It's not ancient or made from silver - but it will remind him of that joyous gathering forever (and, as we've not had a golf tournament since, he is still the reigning men's champion!).

It's easy to take part in the project: just get in touch with me by email at museum.development@clan-macpherson.org, and we'll take it from there.

If we can't meet up in person we'll chat by email, phone or skype. If you're coming to the Gathering and are able to bring your 'object' along we'll be able to photograph it there, and to hear your stories.

You might also know that the Museum is in desperate need of a new roof - please consider donating some money towards that

### THE 2020 JOINT GATHERING

ith this issue you will have received a supplement to the Green Banner, kindly prepared by Graham Gillespie of the United States Branch of the Clan Macpherson Association. This special supplement was initially prepared for US members and provides a comprehensive outline of details of the upcoming joint gathering.

The supplement includes photographs and important details of the venue – the Cairn Croft Best Western Plus Hotel in Niagara Falls, as well as information on local attractions in the area. Details are also provided on travel information.

Rather than reproducing all the information here, we shall point out some of the highlights and urge you to refer to the supplement document for details.

A group rate of \$169.00 is available to those planning to attend the gathering. This rate applies to Friday and Saturday (September 25 and 26, 2020). The supplement provides more information for those interested in extending their stay beyond these dates. Rooms are reserved on a first come, first served basis, so you are urged to book your accommodations sooner than later. It is important to note that rooms can be cancelled up to 45 days prior to check-in without penalty.

As many are already aware, Niagara Falls offers many attractions in the immediate area. Again, the supplement provides comprehensive details on many things that may be of interest to attendees, including information on dining, recreation, shopping, and other interesting attractions.

For those who have arrived by Thursday afternoon, attendees can meet up at Doc Magilligan's Irish Pub if they are so inclined.

Friday begins with breakfast at Doc's Café. The USA Branch

council members will be busy in the morning and early afternoon attending to business, and other attendees are free to do their own thing.

For those that aren't doing touristy things, the third-floor hospitality suite will be open all day. At around 4:30 pm attendees can begin to gather at the Poolside Lounge for a cocktail hour before dinner. Between 5:30 and 8:00 pm attendees can dine at Doc Magilligan's Irish Pub, where there will be a section reserved for the CMA. At 8:00 pm the Ceilidh begins in the nearby Oak Room. Following the Ceilidh attendees are free to head to Doc's Café or to the hospitality suite.

On Saturday morning there is a welcome breakfast for first time AGM attendees. Both the Canadian and US branches will also hold their respective AGMs in the morning.

At 12:30 pm organized tours will head out for the afternoon. The supplement provides details on tours available. In the online registration you will be asked to indicate if you are interested in participating in one of the tours.

The hospitality suite will close at 4:00 pm on Saturday, and the draws will be made for the raffle and silent auction (those attending are encouraged to bring along an item [or several] to help in supporting the AGM's raffle and silent auction). At 5:00 pm there will be a whisky history and tasting event at the hospitality suite.

Everyone will be asked to gather outside the Oak Room in the Poolside Lounge for a group photo at 7:00 pm. This will be followed by a Highland dinner at 7:30 pm. The dinner and ceremonies will be followed by Scottish dancing into the night.

On Sunday morning, attendees may meet at 10:00 am in the Cairn Croft lobby in advance of the short walk to attend a service at Drummond Hill Presbyterian Church. As already indicated, please refer to the supplement for details.
