The clan association is in good shape financially as of the end of June. We have \$8,513 in our current account and \$11,527 in our Life Membership Fund.

We are showing a gain of \$639 year to date at the end of June. The gain is largely because we have received registrations and memberships and have not had to pay any remittances. We have received the refund of the venue deposit, which leaves one deposit outstanding.

ATLANTIC CANADA

Someday the pandemic will be behind us and we can get back to some semblance of our normal lives. When that happens a trip to Atlantic Canada could be a thing to consider.

There are many beautiful things to see here, including the varied and abundant wildlife. One such attraction that we have in common with our Scottish relatives is the presence of the much beloved Atlantic Puffin, which establishes breeding colonies each year along the coastlines of the North Atlantic.

Other than the breeding season in summer, these seabirds spend the rest of their time at sea, never setting foot on land.

When travel restrictions recently eased within the so-called “Atlantic Bubble”, we decided to take a trip that included a ferry ride to Grand Manan Island, New Brunswick.

From there we took another boat out to Machias Seal Island where there is a significant nesting colony of seabirds. Machias Seal Island Migratory Bird Sanctuary is a tiny, treeless island rising barely 9 metres above sea level. It is located 20 kilometres off the southwestern tip of Grand Manan Island in the Bay of Fundy. It is regarded as one of the most important seabird nesting colonies in the Gulf of Maine.

Some estimates suggest that there are approximately to 5000 pairs of Atlantic Puffins, 1000 pairs of Razorbills, and about 500 pairs of Common Murres nesting on the island during breeding season.

Another interesting feature of Machias Seal Island is the fact that it is actually disputed territory, with both the United States and Canada laying claim to it. This doesn't seem to concern the seabirds, as they were busy coming and going out to sea to catch fish to feed their young. Referred to as pufflings.

This small island has a lighthouse that has been maintained by the Canadian Coast Guard for more than 100 years.

Access to Machias Seal Island is very limited and controlled during a very small window during the summer. Machias Seal Island Migratory Bird Sanctuary is located on lands owned by Fisheries and Ocean Canada and is open to the public during most of the year for activities that are consistent with the

conservation goals of the sanctuary. Only one Canadian operator is authorized to bring people there, and are permitted to land only 15 people a day, six days a week.

Each year over 1200 naturalists and photographers visit the sanctuary to see the impressive display of birds on the island.

It was well worth the visit and I would recommend it as a very unique experience.

MACPHERSON DNA PROJECT

The Macpherson DNA project is an ongoing study of YDNA (male line) at Family Tree DNA (FTDNA) to discover our deep ancestry and identify the lines of our men. FTDNA hosts our surname project as well as many others. They are managed by volunteer administrators.

Women are also invited to participate but we cannot test our male line without a father, brother, cousin or uncle (as an example) for our Macpherson line. They must be in the unbroken line going father to son. The males can also test their Mtdna which is their mother's line.

We can all test Family Finder whether we are male or female and there will be more about that as we go along. This is called the Autosomal DNA.

Each surname project has different rules on who can join based on which type of DNA they will accept. The Macpherson project currently accepts all DNA although we do have guidelines for our Autosomal DNA joins.

We see many different septs in our Clan Macpherson Association and all approved by our chief are welcome. Let us all head to a Clan event where we encounter first a Gillespie! Yes, they are in the clan and next a Clark! Then a Smith and an Ellis checking off our registrations and giving us a badge. Finally, we run into a McPherson at the cocktail hour! We found one! Okay we say. I guess we are at the Macpherson party!

Let us talk a bit about what just happened. There are many septs to our clan and we all are under the Macpherson family umbrella but when it comes to DNA we will each need to get into our specific name projects because we have found through the testing we are not all genetically related.

That does not mean there is not a line or two intermarried but for most purposes we will each test at our surname project and then come back together as a larger family united under the Macpherson chief.

The Macpherson project commenced many years ago by our beloved Dr. Alan Gibson Macpherson of Memorial University of Newfoundland. Dr. Alan Macpherson brought a proposal to the clan to test our many lineages and get them identified. Our chief became involved as well and we can proudly say he is at our center. This was just a start. It immediately became apparent as the testing began that the lines would need to be in different projects.

The Macpherson group went on with our band of men who were then separated into their respective groups. Today we are looking at a vastly diverse project with many Y line groups identified and tested to the highest level of BigY 700.

This is the gold standard for all male line testing. While we

have identified a specific snp unique to Macpherson men there are other groups all descending from the area. Historically this would represent the population of the country and how those Macpherson's emerged.

Our goal here is only to introduce and then perhaps get more specific in another article. Our lines have deep ancestry from the entire region. Some are Irish and many, although not all of those, have the Niall of Nine Hostages marker.

It is said those men number around 15 % of the Scottish population overall. Admin Athol McDonald has determined there are around 10% in the Macpherson project at this time.

The number can go up or down depending on the population tested. We also have a line from the region of Ardennes in France, Belgium and Luxembourg looking at descent from the old House of Brabant.

This is a dukedom and modern Flemish researchers are showing a link to King Robert De Brus as it is said he descends from the 4th son of the Duke of Leuven rather than having come on the Norman invasion. Given DNA sequences uncovered that would see a link to one of our groups in project.

There are also lines we know have descended from the Vikings. Then we have our chiefly line as well as many of the cadet lines being grouped and tested to the highest levels available. A wonderful accomplishment! The largest number of our men are in this grouping and our Admin Athol McDonald has made tremendous progress identifying them.

The Macpherson project has advanced rapidly in the past 4 years and we are extremely proud of our group. We remain a project that aims to promote and put the testing of our men at the front.

The Macpherson men are the first line. As previously stated, we also do have Mtdna and Family Finder welcome. Family Finder is our autosomal test at FTDNA, and we accept our Macphersons tested as a compliment and support to our men tested. As a Family Finder Admin, I have personally grouped our folks to be identified with their male line tested.

There are many family lines surrounding our groups which does help in the larger genealogy area. Definite patterns have emerged, and I can often tell which line a family is just by the Macpherson folks they match.

That is not always 100% because some of our lines have been in certain regions for hundreds of years with the same group of families.

This is when our YDNA testing become so important even in family finding. We recommend our members test their male line (YDNA) first and then get their Autosomal (Family Finder) testing. This makes for a much easier search.

REMEMBERING NORMAN MCPHERSON



It was with great sadness that we learned of the passing of Norman McPherson on 21 April, 2020. Norman had been in poor health for some years but had still been taking a full part in our activities. However, at the beginning of February his health issues escalated. After returning home from hospital and being able to say goodbye to family; he died peacefully at home

with his wife Mary by his side.

Norman was a long-standing member of the CMA and was active in the Scottish Branch from its formation from the amalgamation of the 3 regional Scottish branches. He was elected to the Committee at the Branch AGM in 2007, later serving as Vice-Chairman from 2009-2012 and as Chairman from 2012-2015.

As Chairman he ran efficient Committee Meetings and was an excellent Fear an Tigh at Branch events.

Norman was our principal liaison with Clan Chattan and the Association of Highland Clans and Societies, serving on the committees of both organisations. He also served on the Management Advisory Committee of the Clan Museum for several years with responsibility for Health and Safety.

Norman accepted Cluny's invitation in 2009 to take up the role as banner man following John Stuart's passing and it was with great pride that he would lead the Clan March to the Eilan at the Newtonmore Games.

At Burns Suppers Norman introduced other Burns' graces, departing from the traditional Selkirk Grace, and very generously would contribute a raffle prize of a bottle of a special whisky that he had in cask.

He would arrive with a picture quiz prepared by his brother Charlie which would be fixed around the room and keep the arriving diners entertained before the meal.

Visitors to the Clan Tent at the Inverness Games would find Norman at his genial and friendly best giving a warm welcome to all at the Macpherson table and ready to give whatever information and explanations that were asked of him.

His knowledge of the Clan and his enthusiasm never failed to impress, and this would be illustrated by photographs and items of Clan information fixed to pull-up screens which he had brought along.

It was typical of Norman that he continued to contribute to Committee discussions by email during his illness and while still in hospital sent a message apologising for not being able to carry out all his duties at the Burns Supper this year.

Our sympathies and best wishes go to Mary and his family.
